Today the congregation of the Sisters of Mercy has many branches and it is present in over 44 countries. In Kenya the first four Sisters of Mercy arrived from Ireland in 1956.
Over the years many more Mercy Sisters from Ireland, England, Australia, America and other countries have served in Kenya and other African countries. In 1976, formation for Sisters of Mercy started in Kenya.

Since then many young ladies have continued to respond to the service of God as sisters of Mercy and engaged in various ministries.


